To provide this food was a challenge for her and she says, 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.'

She is assured by Elijah who says, 'Do not be afraid, go ahead and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and your son.'

She is called to trust the prophet's words. This she did and shared her family's meagre resources.
