Welcome to Mary MacKillop Place

Perhaps you know that Mary MacKillop came to live in Alma Cottage, North Sydney in 1884. On May 9th of that year she wrote to Sister Monica Phillips about the oasis in which she found herself:

The place is beautifully retired: though near one of the chief streets, it is as quiet as if miles from other people. We have no noise, bustle or excitement, have a nice little garden and paddock with high fences, and little birds singing around us.

St Joseph's Convent, North Sydney eventually spread across 7-11 Mount Street and became home for the professed Sisters of St Joseph, the Novitiate for novices and a Teacher Training College for Sisters and eventually lay people.

In 1995 with the visit of Saint Pope John Paul II to Sydney for the beatification of Mary MacKillop, St Joseph's Convent was opened to the public and renamed as local Aboriginal people had suggested - 'It's her place, so it should be named Mary MacKillop Place'.

Since that day it has been known to all as her place, Mary's resting Place, unique of all places in our land and carrying the description 'out of the ordinary'. Mary MacKillop Place has welcomed thousands of pilgrims and visitors, including Pope Benedict XVI for World Youth Day in 2008.

A special moment here at Mary MacKillop Place was the canonisation of Mary MacKillop in 2010 where we hosted many people to share in the celebrations. This out of the ordinary place has been described by so many as an oasis, just as it was for Mary MacKillop in 1884. Mary MacKillop Place continues to welcome everyone to 'her place' today, and into the future.

Now, 8 years since Pope Benedict XVI declared our Mary, St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, saint for the universal Church, the Board of Mary MacKillop Place asked - *where are we going now?* And so began our strategic thinking.

Over 790 people responded to the Board's invitation to engage in the strategic thinking for the treasured icon known as Mary MacKillop Place. We are most grateful for the wealth of creative thinking offered by these people and trust they recognise their contributions in the pages that follow.

On behalf of the Board, we are pleased to present the strategic directions for Mary MacKillop Place towards 2023.

- Develop an overall plan for long-term sustainability.


Evaluation
